Sadeer Al-Kindi is a physician scientist and a cardiologist. He is the co-director for University Hospitals Cardiometabolic center of excellence, the director for the Cardiovascular Phenomics Core, and the Wolf family scholar in cardiovascular research at University Hospitals. He is also an assistant professor of medicine/radiology/biomedical engineering and a faculty affiliate of the Swetland Environmental Health Center at Case Western Reserve University. He finished his medical school at Weill Cornell Medicine - Qatar, followed by residency in in internal medicine and fellowship in cardiovascular medicine, translational immunology research training and advanced multimodality cardiovascular imaging training at University Hospitals. Most of his research has focused on the intersection between environmental pollution, social determinants of health, and cardiovascular health using computational approaches. He has >250 peer reviewed publications, multiple book chapters and editorials. His research has been funded by multiple sources, including the NIH.
